Pleasant Run Elementary



- *This week, the west side of Area B Main Level is rising to its bearing height.*
- *The Cafeteria follows closely behind and the gym roof will soon be able to be installed.*
- *New sanitary sewer ties were also trenched in this week.*

Taylor Elementary



- ***This week all exterior load bearing walls on the Main Level Area B were built to bearing height and pre-fabricated plumbing piping was put into place.***
- ***On the Lower Level, all interior walls were erected as door frames, electrical conduit, and HVAC duct work was installed.***
- ***The steel erectors were hard at work as they installed bar joists and metal roof decking over the Area A Main Level mechanical closets and the Kitchen area, to be in position for roofing.***

This week we had the Chiller delivered and set, as well as the electric meter base for the new primary power service. Chilled water supply and return piping is going in and will be connected soon and tested.

- ***Area B Lower Level framing is at 95% complete as top out, HVAC hangers, electrical conduit, and roof frames are all going in.***
- ***Main Level Area B CMU bearing walls have started to take off this week and will continue to rise to the Upper Level.***
- ***Lastly, bar joists and metal decking were installed over the food prep area and mechanical portions of Area A.***
